Fostering Collaborations Between the Faculty of Education and Schulich

In this curriculum conversation, Nicole Campbell will share the preliminary findings of a recent collaboration with Isha Decoito from the Faculty of Education that focused on program evaluation of a new and innovative Master of Science Program that is being offered at Schulich. These findings highlight the student's rationale for enrolling in the program and their future career goals. During her presentation, Nicole will discuss how this collaboration came to be and share why it has been such a valuable experience for the graduate program and also for her professional development. Hopefully this conversation will spark future collaborations between these two faculties.

About the Presenter:

Dr Nicole Campbell is an Associate Professor of Physiology and Pharmacology and the Director of Interdisciplinary Medical Sciences at the Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry at Western University. She teaches 4th year undergraduate students and is leading a new course-based MSc in interdisciplinary medical sciences. She is a teaching fellow for her Faculty (2018 to 2022) and Western experiential learning scholar (2020 to 2022). She received several awards for teaching and innovation, including the Marilyn Robinson Award for Teaching Excellence in 2019. As part of her teaching fellowship, she is studying strategies for assessing and demonstrating student achievement of core competencies and skill development.
